
ASME Scholarships are grants made to enable or assist a student in pursuing an educational program in mechanical engineering or mechanical engineering technology at the undergraduate or graduate level.

ASME Scholarship Program at a Glance:

- Only ASME undergraduate or graduate student members in good standing are eligible for academic scholarships.
- Note ASME student membership is required to login to the online application system. (Join ASME or renew your membership at go.asme.org/join).
- Complete only one application for all ASME Scholarships in this group.

Apply once to be considered for a variety of scholarships!

- Applicants must be accepted and enrolled in an ABET accredited school for the upcoming academic year starting in the fall.
- The online application is open once a year, and students must apply again each year.
