The ECLIPSE Intern program is one path ASME offers to promote and recognize the value of long-term leadership development and diversity among its members. ECLIPSE is a commitment to, and investment in, the careers of high-potential early-career members.

Objectives

Guidance

Learn your way around ASME with a dedicated advisor. Each intern is matched with a senior volunteer within a particular area of interest at ASME, who will serve as their personal professional coach. You will be nurtured to be a future leader in ASME.

Training

Participate in workshops and training sessions to build your leadership and management skills.

Networking

Take advantage of the opportunity to network among your peers and senior ASME leaders to see how you can incorporate the ASME experience into your career development.

Leadership

Gain leadership skills in your professional and personal life. You will be prepared to take the reins as an ASME leader.

As an ECLIPSE Participant...

Participants are assigned to a unit within the Society:

- ▶ Board of Governors
- ▶ Institutes Sector
- ▶ Knowledge & Community Sector
- ▶ Public Affairs & Outreach Sector
- ▶ Standards and Certification Sector
- ▶ ASME Foundation
- ▶ Center for Research and Technology Development
- ▶ Volunteer Orientation and Leadership Training Academy

You are matched with this unit for a period of one year and work closely with an assigned coach to complete one or more projects throughout the year.

Participants travel to several meetings and networking engagements of approximately three days' duration throughout the program period.

ASME offers a travel contribution to help offset the cost of transportation, food and lodging. It encourages cost sharing of these expenses with the interns' employers.

ECLIPSE Kickoff

Applications are available starting in October. The program officially kicks off with the Annual Meeting in June. Participants are also required to attend the International Mechanical Engineering Congress and Exposition (IMECE) in November and a second Annual Meeting the following June to conclude their program activities. They may also have the opportunity to attend additional meetings during the year.
